EarthKind Roses are available at many nurseries throughout the country, but remember - these roses must be growing on their own roots (and not grafted) to be EarthKind!

Expanded Shale Resources



TXI is the producer of the expanded shale that Texas A&M tested in the EarthKind Trials. Their production facility is located in Boulder, CO.

They sell 2 particle sizes of expanded shale in Colorado - 1/4th inch which they call "medium" and a 1/2 inch particle size. The size tested is the 1/4th inch size - so if you are looking for it, ask for the "medium" size.

All of these distributors supply nurseries with TXI expanded shale, and could direct you to the nurseries in your area that they supply.

Note: The distributors also sell the expanded shale as a single product, or pre-mixed with compost. Do not buy the expanded shale that is pre-mixed with mulch as you not want to till the mulch into the soil as that would rob the soil of nitrogen.
